**Updated now:** see CPMR <u>maritime agenda</u> (version June 2015)

Maritime safety and ecological dammage, an important priority for CRPM

### **Ecological dammage not directly covered:**

- At international level: not recognised
- At EU level: EU ELD does not apply to issues covered by international conventions

Available IOPC compensations limited and priority for national authorities is for civil victims to get compensation first.

As a consequence, very little chances to get compensation for ecological dammage

Setting up clearer compensation mechanisms (as it is the case in the USA for instance) would:

- Stimulate prevention
- Provide better legal certainty to the shipping sector
- Avoid divergent interpretation of international conventions (See Erika caselaw in France)
- Enable for better compensation
- Be consistent with the MSFD process

**European Commission currently analysing the implementation the ELD Directive:** 

 Studies published so far for the EC recommend for ELD to cover ecological dammage:

EC report to be published at fall 2015

IOPC: specific work on environmental dammage to be developped in 2016

Undertanding and assessment of ecological dammage is crucial (and possible today)

#### **Arcopol:**

- Brings relevant expertise
- Contributes to the MSFD implementation

#### More EU support and coordination is needed to:

- Share expertise accross Europe
- Develop research on ecological dammage/new pollution risks (e.g. HNS)



European Parliament - Feirerra report « Untapping the potential of research and innovation in the blue economy to create jobs and growth"

Believes that a maritime safety "Erika IV" package should be launched to prevent further major maritime disasters; considers that this package should recognise the ecological damage to marine waters in the European legislation
